

The album tells a story and changes your life.


Synopsis

The pandemic of 2020 sends the nation into lockdown, and Phoebe Ellis, a college freshman is forced to move back in with her foster mother, and spirals into despair.

Isolated and living in her cluttered bed, Phoebe yearns for a time before social media and global chaos. A cruel prank and a mysterious suitcase of artifacts propel Phoebe into a vivid fantasy set in 1998, where she steps into somebody else's shoes, and lives a reality she had only ever dreamed of.

In this nostalgic past, she joins a circle of friends and meets Charley, a brooding, working-class frontman of an emerging alternative rock band. Unaware of the impending digital revolution that will reshape the music industry forever, Phoebe is determined that they seize their big break—one that has now become her own chance at redemption.

Living in a seemingly innocent time, when things "still mattered", she has been granted a chance at happiness. Or has she? Navigating the turbulence of change and loss — courage and confidence are elusive, opportunities are fleeting. Bringing back "wack slacks" and "fuzz," bridging the gap between two eras, this tale explores the familyhood of a band, sticking to your guns, and what it means to be given a second chance.



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Music

Based on an authentic story, the music in GRUNGE includes never before released songs from the band Charley Django. Including demo tracks from "Lyriculous Meloddities" & "Demoliberation" recorded between 1992 and 1994 in a converted warehouse the old Dutchboy paint factory in Oakland, CA. The unreleased album "Outside the Market" was recorded at Dancing Dog Studios in Emeryville, California. Along with Paul Siegel on lead vocals and guitar, bandmates include bassist Jon Evans (Tori Amos), drummer Scott Amendola (Charlie Hunter) and keyboards Charlie Gillingham (Counting Crows).

Paul Martin Siegel

Music



Paul Siegel grew up off the Palisades Parkway outside of New York City where he started writing songs and composing at the age of 10. A great inspiration was his uncle Larry Siegel, lead writer of the Carol Burnett Show. Larry Siegel wrote the 1966 Off-Broadway musical revue "The Mad Show"

and collaborated with Stephen Sondheim. Paul expanded on those formative years and devoted himself full-time to narrative songwriting forming the band Charley Django in 1992. Paul has performed and written music for over 3 decades with industry professionals, including Grammy award winners. The people and songs from this time period are the source of inspiration behind "Grunge" the musical.

Leyna d'Ancona Book



Leyna is a writer, director and dancer. Her stage career developed in New York City where she trained at Steps on Broadway, and the Martha Graham School of Contemporary Dance. Leyna earned her B.A. in comparative literature at UC Berkeley. Her directorial

experience began with projects auditing the graduate program of UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television. She later worked with The Pacific Film Archive (BAMPFA), Canyon Cinema, and the SF Cinematheque. Survivor of two social revolutions, and witness by happenstance to the rise and fall of indie rock bands, Leyna artfully combines skill and memory to write the story of "Grunge."

As a writer, 16 of his plays are published that include Shakespeare's R&J, In The Absence of Spring, and Walter Cronkite is Dead. He directed the national tour of Ring of Fire, and regionally his credits include Lincolnesque (world premiere) and The Glass Menagerie at The Old Globe; Urinetown, Side Show, Assassins.
